Background:

The *National Council of University Research Administrators (NCURA)* is a US non-profit professional society dedicated to advancing the profession of research administration through education and professional development programs, the sharing of knowledge and experiences, and the fostering of a diverse, collegial, and respected global community. *Global Initiatives* seeks to be the foremost provider of professional development, knowledge, and leadership in the global research administration and research management community. We serve all NCURA members - in the International Region and U.S. members who are involved in global research administration- by providing a global network of organizations and institutions for support and partnerships.

The *Finnish Association of Research Managers and Advisors* (Finn-ARMA) brings together research administration and management experts from higher education institutions and research institutes in Finland. Its core mission is to promote co-operation, exchange information and enhance the professional development of its members. Currently the network has ca. 500 members.

The *Finnish-American Research & Innovation Accelerator* (FARIA) is a strategic US-focused platform, which integrates, aligns and supports joint & associated actions of Finnish member institutions.

1. It creates visibility for Finnish RDI-excellence and simplifies contact facilitation between Finland and key-regions in the US.
2. It serves as launch pad for concrete RDI-projects from ideation over funding generation to implementation.
3. It supports an alignment of Finnish US-engagement activities

To date there are 12 Finnish universities and 4 universities of applied sciences organized in FARIA. We represent 89 % of the national RDI-power within the higher education sector.
